What is PBIS?

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- Data driven approach to addressing student behavior
- **☆☆☆☆☆☆☆☆☆☆** Focuses on explicitly teaching, modeling, practicing, and recognizing appropriate behavior
 - Is a proactive system of supports
 - Addresses classroom, school wide, and district wide behavior issues
- **☆** Means that expectations are consistent and clearly defined in all settings
 - Always looks for ways to make the smallest changes that will result in the largest positive effect

Students can earn Super Stetson tickets for displaying the "IB Attitudes" in the hallways, cafeteria, or dismissal areas. When a student receives a ticket, they bring it to the office, sign the celebrity notebook and draw a number to put their ticket in on the 100's chart.
